





King County Local Health Officer Order

Large public events, indoor recreational establishments, gyms, restaurants, and bars must require customers to show proof of vaccination or negative test.





Beginning October 25:

Customers will be required to show proof of COVID-19 vaccination or negative test to enter:

- Outdoor events with 500 people or more (including professional and collegiate sports and entertainment events)
- Indoor recreational events or establishments (including professional and collegiate sports, entertainment, performing arts, theatre, live music, gyms and conferences)
- Restaurants and bars (including indoor dining). This does not apply to outdoor dining, take-out customers, and places that aren't primarily used as a restaurant such as grocery stores.

This does not apply to children under 12




Professional sports regardless of size

Beginning December 6:

Customers will be required to show proof of COVID-19 vaccination or negative test to enter:

Restaurants and bars with seating capacity of 12 or less





What is considered proof of vaccination?

- A CDC Vaccine card or photo of vaccine card
- Documentation from medical record / vaccine provider
- Proof of vaccination from another state or country
- Mobile apps from healthcare providers (approved by WA Department of Health)
- Printed certificate or QR code (available at the end of September) from MyIRMobile.com

You do not need to show identification with proof of vaccination.



What is MyIR Mobile?

MyIR Mobile is an internet-based portal that gives people access to their official state vaccination records.

You can set up an account at:

www.MyIRMobile.com

MyIR Mobile is currently limited to English language only. For language assistance, or additional help getting your records, call the Washington State Vaccine Helpline at (833) 829-4357 or email waissrecords@doh.wa.gov



If you are unvaccinated or cannot prove vaccine status, then you must:

 show proof of a negative PCR COVID-19 test in the last 72 hours,

OR

 a negative rapid test result from a testing provider conducted on site at an event or establishment just prior to entry.





Checklist

| Each bu | siness operates differently, but it is important to plan ahead to ensure a smooth implementation of this new policy. |
|---------|--|
| | Identify dates and times for staff meetings and any necessary training. |
| | Hang signage showing customers that your business is complying with the King County order. |
| | Identify and communicate with staff the most appropriate time for employees to ask patrons for verification. |
| | If venue is providing rapid testing, outline a process and communicate that process with employees. |
| | Conduct trainings with employees to be sure they are familiar with valid proofs of vaccination, COVID-19 tests and anti-discrimination policies. |
| | Talk through potential scenarios with employees (see ideas in "Scenarios" section). |

Scenarios

- Customer/patron resists providing vaccine verification or a negative COVID-19 test
 - Businesses can explain that this is a King County order and that the establishment cannot provide indoor service without verification.
 - Businesses can offer alternatives like outside options or takeout.
 - Businesses must do their best to enforce this order but will not be held accountable for customer's behavior.






