#### **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

The program's focus is to offer targeted relief in the form of one-time grants to small for-profit and non-profit businesses that have experienced financial hardship due to COVID-19 and related public health measures.

In this round of Working Washington grants, available funds are set aside for specific targeted groups or sectors:

- 60% is identified for the arts, heritage, and science sectors, including those that operate live entertainment venues
- 40% is identified for most other sectors, including hospitality, fitness and personal services

### **General Timeline:**

- August 17, 2022 September 9, 2022: Application portal will open. Application period will remain open for 24 days
- Mid Late September: Review of applications
- Early October: Notify grantees and disburse funding

Washington State Department of Commerce has partnered with Submittable to manage the application process and distribute awards. If you do not currently have a Submittable account, you will be prompted to register prior to accessing the online application. Submittable recommends using Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, or Apple Safari as browsers.

The Grant Application may be completed and submitted online at any time during the application period. The portal will open the morning of Wednesday, August 17, and close Friday, September 9, at 5:00 PM PT.

Please take your time when completing the application. Drafts of the application are automatically saved and the application does not need to be completed in one sitting.
